The workshop will begin with an overview of psycho-trauma terminology and concepts, including perpetrator transference, perpetrator bonding, and perpetrator introjection, as developed and utilised in the more than 25-year-old old analytical, body-oriented Gestalt model, SPIM30: Somatic Psychological Interactive Model Nr30.

In this context, new perspectives on the interactional imprints of violent transgressions on children and adults are especially significant. The treatment model incorporates new concepts of embodied learning and different models for externalising internal and external processes – using body language and intuition.

The focus will subsequently be on three case studies that illustrate the application of body-oriented analytical treatment steps. This approach is thoroughly documented and evidenced with photographs and appropriately indicated.

The talk will close with a Q&A session where participants are invited to discuss the therapeutic approach or bring their own deductions.

Dr. Ralf Vogt is a psycho-traumatologist and body-oriented psychoanalyst for individual and group psychotherapy in private practice. Dr Vogt has eight years of clinical experience in acute psychiatry and is also an analytical body psychotherapist, systemic family therapist and practitioner of imaginative psychotherapy and has been working with complexly traumatised/dissociative patients for over 25 years.



Together with his wife Irina they developed their own treatment program for dissociative psycho-traumatic disorders from 2000. (SPIM-20-KT, later SPIM 30). In 2002 they founded the Trauma Institute Leipzig as a training and research centre. Additionally, they work as lecturers in psycho-trauma in other national and international institutes. Ralf has been teaching their SPIM 30 training programme to prospective psycho-trauma therapists and psycho-trauma counsellors for many years.
